



Augustus and the Power of Memory



Main topics and disciplines involved (at present stage)

- Two main LIMS 'souls': historical and sociological
- Main topics: forms of constitution and transmission of social memory in ancient as well as contemporary societies; relationship between memory and history/historiography; mnemohistory of the ancient world; anthropology of oral tradition; war commemoration and war trauma from antiquity to today; public monumentality and spaces; ethnic identity; migration and conflict; cultural trauma; decommemoration and de-colonization
- Further collaborations within the University of Trento are in progress with other disciplinary areas: legal anthropology; transitional justice; psychology; literature and media

Past and present activities

- Workshops, lectures, and conferences
- Curricular course 'Memory studies and history' for Master students (taught by G. Proietti at the Dept. of Humanities since 2019), with a multi-disciplinary angle and a couple of guest lectures each year
- MA dissertations
- Methodological seminars for PhD students
- Informal lunch seminars
- Networking and outreach, both on a local and an international scale

LIMS MA thesis in 2022/2023 and 2023/2024 (supervisor: G. Proietti), for instance:

- 'From Ars Oblivionis to Forgetting Studies: forms of decommemoration in Greek antiquity and today'
- Ernesto De Martino's religious anthropology meets memory studies: tarantism in Southern Italy's cultural memory
- War, literature, and memory in Japan: Yoko Ogawa's narrative(s) of trauma
- De-colonizing Classics: the transformations of Medea's myth in the second half of the 20° century
- The public commemoration of the war dead as an antidote to war trauma in 5° century Athens
